What is Relay For Life?

The Irish Cancer Society has partnered with Relay For Life to work with communities across Ireland, to celebrate cancer survivors, to remember those we have lost and to raise awareness of the services provided by the Irish Cancer Society.

Celebrate Cancer Survivors

At Relay we celebrate cancer survivors from our community as VIPs who provide hope and inspiration. At Relay, we also celebrate caregivers, who give time, love, and support to their friends and family facing cancer.

Remember - Candle of Hope

As darkness falls, the Candle of Hope Ceremony takes place and we remember the people affected by cancer. The candle bags are dedicated to someone lost to cancer or in celebration of a Survivor. They remind the community that we will never forget the pain caused by cancer and that we will never let our determination to live in a world where no-one dies from cancer be diminished.

Come together as a Community

Relay helps the community fight back against cancer. At Relay we support people in our community affected by cancer. We fund research. We fund vital services such as Night Nursing and the Volunteer Driver Service. We encourage the community to make lifestyle choices that will reduce their risk of cancer.





Your step-by-step guide to being a Team Captain



Step 1 - Build your team

Reach out to your family, friends or colleagues and ask them to join your team. Teams are the heart and soul of Relay. Together you will raise funds, have fun and make a huge difference to the lives of cancer patients across the country.



Step 2 – Start fundraising

Step 3 – Get the word out

Take on a team challenge

Put you and your team's stamina to the test by taking on a challenge like a marathon, cycling or spinning event. You can get the whole team involved and collect pledges from your friends and family in the lead up to the event.

Government guidelines

Check in with Government guidelines to ensure your fundraiser is safe to hold.

Start early

The earlier you begin, the more people you can reach and the easier your fundraising will be.

Fundraise online

Check in with your committee for the link to create your online fundraising page. Share this with family and friends, it's a great way for those who can't attend to support your event.

Set a goal

Having a set goal to reach is a great motivator to help you reach your target!

Word of mouth

Tell your friends, family and colleagues that you're raising money to fund support services and life-changing research. Send a text and share details for your event through email, WhatsApp or Messenger.



Share on social

The quickest way to promote your fundraiser to the masses. Share your Relay event on platforms such as Facebook, Instagram and Twitter.

- Reach out to people impacted by cancer through over 22,500 supportive and comforting conversations with the Irish Cancer Society's Support Line and Daffodil Centre nurses
- Provide 7,323 nights of Night Nursing, to allow patients at end of life to spend their final days surrounded by their loved ones.
- Continue to be the voice of the cancer community as the world focused on the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Bring our Your Health Matters roadshow to 10 locations nationwide, educating 19,000 people face-to-face on how they can catch the signs of cancer early.

Thank you for registering your team for Relay — we really appreciate your support. We want your fundraising to be a safe and enjoyable experience, so please read these terms and conditions. If you need any further information we're just a phone call away on 0810 10 20 30.

Fundraising for the Irish Cancer Society and Relay For Life:

- All activities must be conducted in accordance with all applicable laws.
- The Relay Team in the Irish Cancer Society and your local Relay committee are happy to offer advice and guidance.
- If you are organising a public collection or a raffle where tickets are sold to the public, you should contact your local Garda station for advice.
- Your events should state clearly that they are run by the Relay For Life team in aid of your local Relay For Life event and the Irish Cancer Society.
- Please contact your Relay For Life Committee before contacting local businesses for contributions, or sponsorship.

Cash Handling and Banking

To comply with audit requirements and to preserve the integrity of the organiser, at least two people should count and lodge the funds raised. All net proceeds must be submitted to the Irish Cancer Society or to your Relay For Life committee within 30 days of the Relay.

Insurance

Fundraising activities and events organised by Relay For Life teams in advance of the 24-hour event are not covered by the insurance policy for the 24-hour event. Teams who are planning activities in advance of the 24-hour event must seek their own insurance advice and arrange appropriate cover.
