

As easy as sending an email or text!

Virtual collections are one of the safest and most effective ways to allow your community to donate directly to your collection this Daffodil Day. It's as simple as sending out a text, email or posting on social media.

A virtual community collection is an online fundraising page and is the perfect accompaniment to your street sales or other Daffodil Day fundraising activities. It allows you to reach a wider range of people who are eager to support Daffodil Day in your community. It is also a terrific insurance policy against a wet or disrupted Daffodil Day. You have a ready-made method by which those that may not be on the streets can still donate, with all the funds going directly towards your Daffodil Day collection.

Whilst virtual collections and online fundraising may seem complicated, it really is simple and you don't have to do a thing (other than tell us what you would like the page to be called!).

Supporting a virtual collection in your community is simple.

- 1. Let us know what you want your virtual community collection to be called. It can be named after your local area, in your own name or dedicated to someone in particular.
- 2. We will set up your virtual community collection page and text or email you a unique link.
- 3. Simply send that link to your volunteers, family, friends and colleagues and ask them to donate or share the link with their network. You will be amazed at how quickly your page can reach thousands and all donations and payments will feed directly into your overall total, with the funds sent automatically to the Irish Cancer Society!

Get local primary schools involved!

What better way to get to the heart of your community than by encouraging your local primary schools to participate in Daffodil Day.

Schools will be encouraged to hold a non-uniform day and wear yellow or any colour of their choosing. They will also be provided with materials to help them decorate their classroom. Schools can also deliver a Daffodil Day art experience, a Daffodil Day fitness challenge or both. There will be plenty of ways for primary schools to get involved.

Get local businesses involved!

This Daffodil Day we are encouraging shops and businesses to 'Paint it Yellow', in support of cancer patients and their families. Why not become a Paint it Yellow Ambassador and recruit local businesses and shops to take part in Daffodil Day whilst raising vital funds and awareness?

As a Paint it Yellow Ambassador you will be sent starter packs that you can share with local shops and businesses to encourage them to Paint it Yellow, in support of Daffodil Day. Each pack will contain a countertop box of daffodil pins to sell, posters, balloons and other items to help them decorate and promote Daffodil Day throughout March.

At the end of the month you simply collect the boxes and lodge the funds, all of which count towards your Daffodil Day total. Lodge your funds

Thank you for all your work raising vital funds to support cancer patients. To ensure your hard-earned funds can be put to good use immediately, please lodge funds as soon as possible and within four weeks of your event.

Ways to lodge your funds

1. At any AIB

Take your completed Irish Cancer Society giro to any AIB branch.

Don't forget to include your Supporter Number, <MERGE FIELD FOR SUPPORTER ID>, on any bank giros or ATM lodgements.

2. Online

Visit www.cancer.ie/lodgefunds and use our online form to submit your funds raised using your credit card, debit card or PayPal.

If you have a virtual collection page or set up your own online sponsorship page, your funds will be transferred automatically to us once every month.

3. By Post

Post a cheque or bank draft together with your name, address and Supporter Number to: Irish Cancer Society, 43/45 Northumberland Road, Dublin 4. All cheques must be made out to 'Irish Cancer Society'. Please write any further information (such as your supporter ID: <MERGE FIELD FOR SUPPORTER ID>) on the back of the cheque.

4. By Phone

Call the Fundraising Team on 0818 10 20 30 and donate or lodge your funds by debit or credit card.

5. At the Post Office

When lodging funds at your local Post Office, it is important you give us a call on 0818 10 20 30 to let us know the details so we can issue you with a receipt and ensure the funds are allocated to your record.


